Kimberly Camp – “The Hanford Reach”

Kimberly Camp, CEO for the Richland Public Facility District, is charged with turning the vision for the Heritage and Visitor Center at Hanford Reach into a reality. Her presentation was both enthusiastic and pragmatic.

She brings experience in very large “from the ground up” museum projects and is determined to make the new \$40+ million, 61,000 sq. ft. Heritage and Visitor Center grow into a success story as a resource for the Tri-Cities. Over half of the funds

needed have already been raised.

The project benefits from the cooperation of multiple boards of stakeholders supporting the project. About half the funds still need to be raised, a challenge in these difficult times, but the project is taking a realistic approach to what it can best be and who it can best serve.

The nuclear industry that so characterizes the Tri-Cities is just one part of the Historic and Cultural significance the Heritage Center will offer. Kimberly envisions the Center as a *cultural catalyst* bringing together many different aspects with the idea of exciting interest in the many sources of learning about where we live and where it all came from.

Besides serving as headquarters to the National Monument, the Center will become a source of “recreational edu-tainment” for people living in the region. Though thought has been given to making the Center a *destination* in and of itself, its success will rest on how well it serves the local ongoing needs that are cultivated within our community.

When the new Center opens in the summer of 2011, Kimberly expects a full sized Columbian Mammoth to become the center piece providing an iconic image that will remind us all of the many layers of history in this region.
